Secondary School Journey 2018!

A highlight of the week was, as always, the campfire on the last evening when everyone enjoys a social time together and we roast marshmallows while the sun sets on another school journey.

Satellites are open!

The Satellites opened in September 2017 and this year have been based at Robert Blair School, the Cape youth provision linking with Ashmount School and the Zone youth club which is between The Bridge Secondary and Holloway Schools. Some of our sites are moving next year. The children at the Cape will be moving to Hungerford School and will have a classroom inside the school.

The secondary pupils will be moving to Highgate Hill School. This is a new school and has some spare space at present. We are having the technology wing modified for our exclusive use. The school will also grow in size next year catering for up to 50 pupils.







The Satellites provide educational provision for pupils with autism who can access the national curriculum but need additional support with their social and communication needs. If you would like to know more about the Satellites please don't hesitate to contact me.

Research Update

This year saw the launch of our Research strategy for 2017 to 2019. A key part of this was our Learning Communities. Staff from across the Trust joined together to examine one of nine different focus areas ('communities') such as Sensory Support or Social Communication. They discussed possible changes to practice or new ideas that could be put in place. The recommendations from the communities will then be passed on to the Senior Leadership Team who will then take action to help ensure that new ideas are examined further.

Part of our strategy also involves sharing the work that we do here and building up the profile of research carried out in schools in general. We launched our research Twitter account @Bridge_Research to provide a way of sharing our work. We once again attended the annual conference for the International Society for Autism Research (INSAR) – the world's largest autism research conference. As well as presenting our work on mapping anxiety undertaken at the ILS, we gave a talk about our Sensory Snack Time program that has been running on the Primary site. We also shared this work at The British Psychological Society's Annual Developmental Section Conference.

We were invited to speak about our work to teachers and other practitioners at Exeter University's Graduate School of Education Annual Research Conference and at a ResearchSEND conference in Wolverhampton. We also won the SEN category in the Chartered College of Teaching's inaugural Research Poster Competition!
