
## Our School Improvement Focus this week: Mental Health and Wellbeing

Welcome back to school and a Happy New Year to you. Whilst it is not the start to term we had all expected we are open and have been impressed with how engaged all of our learners have been whether working remotely or from the school site. They then all ran around role playing a game of their own creation, still wearing the hard hats and vests. A bit of den building went on as well. There was lots of conversation about things the children would like to have in the Forest School area.
