We all love Lego. Look at this dinosaur that is under construction. Just the head to go. It has taken lots of patience and skill to build this. A true Lego superstar!





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

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
One of the Pupils in Hedgehogs has been drawing this week. They studied the work of Van Gogh and have reproduced their version of Starry Night.

how much water each vessel holds. Can you guess which holds the most? Or the least?



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
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

Mrs K showed us how to make a home mathematical manipulative set! You can collect bits and pieces from round the house and use them to help you do your maths.
