




This week's School Improvement Focus: Reading


Using "things" to help us do maths is so important but can be

us how to put them in numicon shapes. Straws became homemade Cuisenaire rods. Egg boxes became sorting pots and plastic cups became number trays.











Why not have a go at making your own manipulatives at home and send us some pictures?


Children in the Elephants class have done some great work in the style of Frida Kahlo. She is from Mexico and she painted lots of pieces using nature and

Koalas and Elephants have been telling the time this week. They have used the analogue clock. I like the idea of knowing when breakfast, lunch and tea are!









If you would like any help with this let Mr Evans know. He will be happy to help.


