



## School News


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We have all made it to half term. I hope everyone has a relaxing week.




Maybe you could have a go at pattern making over the half term? You could use anything. Buttons, shells, pasta, toys..... the list is endless!

The days at Fen are certainly filled with laughter!




Reading is a big part of curriculum at school. We all have daily reading time. What will you read over half term?
